- System requirements What computers can run the EwE source code?
- Download sources from SVN Download the EwE sources from our central SVN server.
- Install Visual Studio Visual Studio Community Edition is the development environment that we use to program EwE. This is required if you want to program or look into the source code of EwE.
- Install Access drivers Make sure your system has the Access 2010 drivers installed that EwE needs.
- Loading and compiling the Ecopath source code This section describes how to run the scientific interface from the sources.
